COURSE OVERVIEW AND OBJECTIVES

This course will aid the student in building a solid foundation for proper Bible study. It will cover methods for observing and investigating a text of scripture, applying appropriate hermeneutical and exegetical principles, and arriving at a correct understanding and application of the text.

COURSE REQUIRMENTS

Class Attendance

Class attendance is required and will be checked at each session. A student who misses more that 25% of the class meetings will forfeit credit for the class and receive a failing grade, unless an arrangement is made with the professor to complete the work online. Students are expected to be in class on time.

Reading Assignments (25% of Final Grade)

Notebook Assignment (25% of Final Grade)

Keep a notebook devoted specifically to this course. The notebook should contain all course handouts along with all of the notes and assignments that you do for this course. Organization of materials is important to make them accessible for future use.

Research Project (50% of Final Grade)

The research project will be assigned during the final class.

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Each student will be provided a section of Scripture.

The student is required to perform a hermeneutical analysis including:

- The Observations from the Text
- The Interpretation of the Text
- The Applications from the Text

This research project will be submitted in the following format.

A title page which includes the course title, number, student name, and professor name.

The body of the project should be well-organized and be no less than three pages and no more than five pages (double spaced).

A properly cited bibliography page (Student may choose APA or MLA formatting).
